Intake/Assessment Coordinator, Intake/Assessment

Responsibilities:

- Provide daily leadership/clinical consultation to intake/assessment specialists, behavioral health specialists, and care coordination specialists.
- Provide oversight and assign clients to staff caseloads, monitor due dates and assist team as needed in staying current with documentation on their caseloads. Run monthly caseloads.
- Assist Intake/Assessment Supervisor in leading a monthly Intake/Assessment Meeting
- Assist Intake/Assessment Supervisor maintain monthly intake stats.
- Accept assessments assigned by Intake/Assessment Supervisor. Complete assessments as scheduled in a timely
 manner. Evaluate individuals for appropriate services and make all necessary referrals, both within and outside the
 agency.
- Assist in developing services to a caseload of clients, who have a mental illness which is serious and persistent.
- Assist individuals who live independently in the community via linking and referring to housing, food and transportation resources, applying for entitlements, providing counseling and life skills training and advocating for the individual's needs.
- Provide intervention and support in times of crisis
- Review and sign off on non-licensed clinicians' paperwork as assigned as the QMHP and/or LPHA as appropriate.

Care Coordination Specialist, Intake/Assessment – 2 positions available

Responsibilities:

- Assist clients in referring and accessing necessary resources, including mental health services, substance use
 treatment, housing, educational, employment, and social services as necessary to facilitate wellness and recovery of
 the whole person. Obtain necessary consents for sharing information with community partners including
 documenting attempts and revisiting periodically.
- Assist in maintaining a caseload of clients, who have a mental illness and/or substance use challenges and ensure
 individuals have access to primary and other supportive care services.
- Collaborate with multidisciplinary teams to develop and implement individualized care plans that address clients' mental health, physical health, and social needs.
- Provides minimum monthly outreach and supports to a caseload of individuals engaged in behavioral health services ensuring their insurance or other payor information is up to date.
- Build and maintain relationships with local inpatient acute-care hospitals and related facilities, such as emergency
 departments and outpatient clinics. Ensure timely communication by documenting efforts to contact individuals
 discharged from these settings within 24 hours, including managing the transfer of health records related to their
 services.
- Complete treatment plans, annual re-assessments, and IATPs for a caseload of clients, DLA and LOCUS
 assessments as required.

Qualifications:

- Bachelor's Degree in Human Services field or 5 years equivalent experience to qualify as an MHP

- Experience working with co-occurring mental health and substance use needs and/or the unhoused a plus

Mobile Crisis Counselor, MCR

Responsibilities:

- Provide triage, assessment, crisis de-escalation/resolution, coordination with local hospitals, police, fire, medical, and behavioral health services, crisis planning, and follow-up
- Manage walk-in, telephone, and community-based crises
- Deliver services primarily in the community where the client is located, including shelters and client homes
- Provide referral and disposition options appropriate to the client's needs and safety including warm hand-offs to referral sources. Schedule outpatient follow-ups.
- Respond to Call4Calm requests and regional crisis call hubs such 988
- Evaluate unfunded individuals and apply for Medicaid. Coordinate with the CARES line for individuals funded with Medicaid
- Serves as QMHP for MHP and CRSS level staff providing Crisis Intervention on the Mobile Crisis Team
